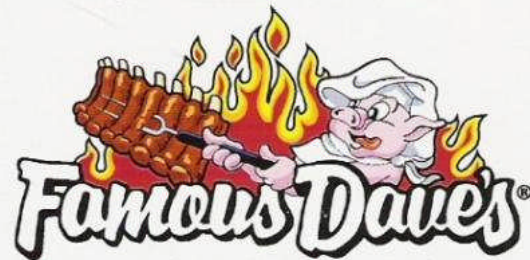
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## ***BOY! IT'S HOT OUT THERE!***

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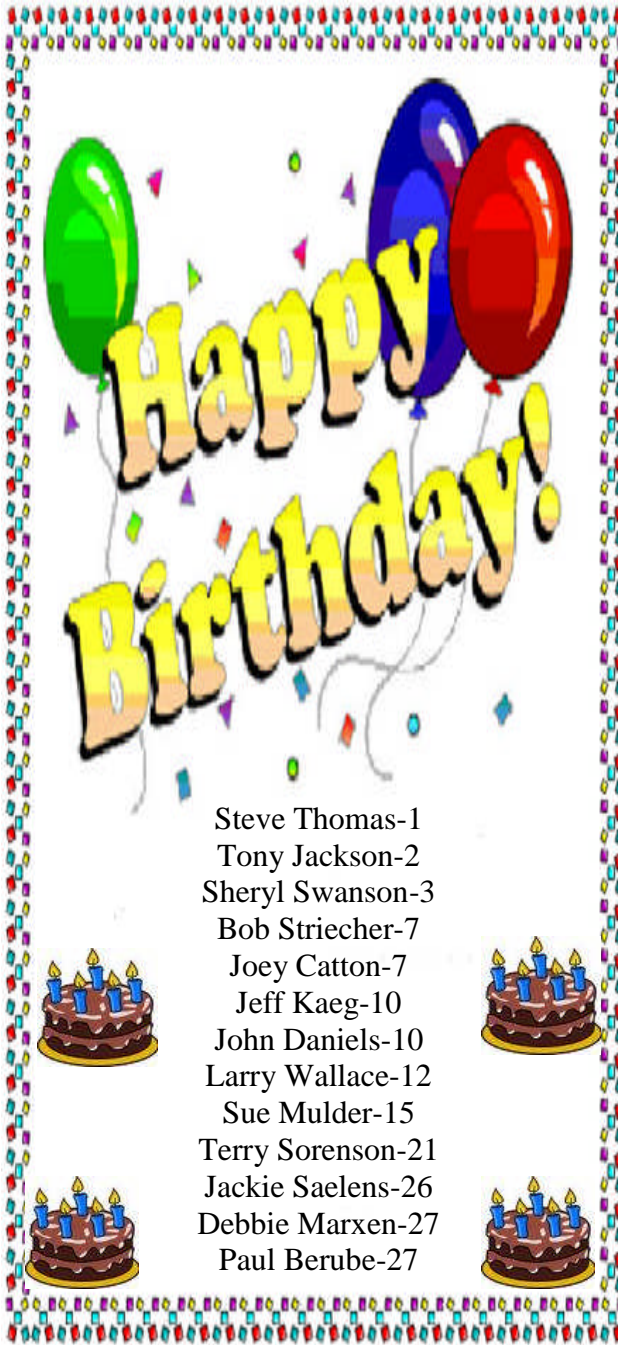
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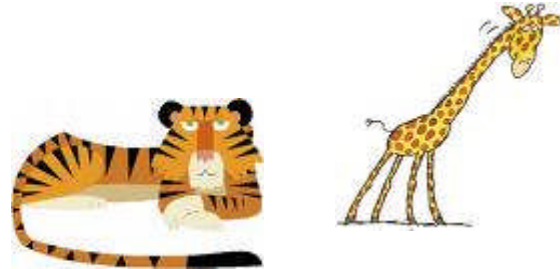

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# What's Cookin...

## Classic Deviled Eggs

- 6 boiled eggs
- 3 Tablespoons mayonnaise or Miracle Whip
- 1 Tablespoon sugar
- 1 tablespoon mustard (yellow, spicy brown or Boetje's)
- 1 teaspoon vinegar
- ¼ teaspoon of salt and pepper

To hard cook eggs place eggs in enough cold water to cover completely, bring to a rolling boil

over high heat; then reduce heat to a lower boil and cook an additional 12 minutes. Promptly chill eggs in ice water to help keep yolks bright yellow. Remove shells from eggs and halve lengthwise

with a knife. Carefully remove yolks and place in a medium bowl. Mash yolks with a fork. Add remaining ingredients ; mix well. I use a hand blender to whip all the ingredients together which results in a smooth creamy mixture. Garnish with a light sprinkling of paprika (optional). Refrigerate until served.

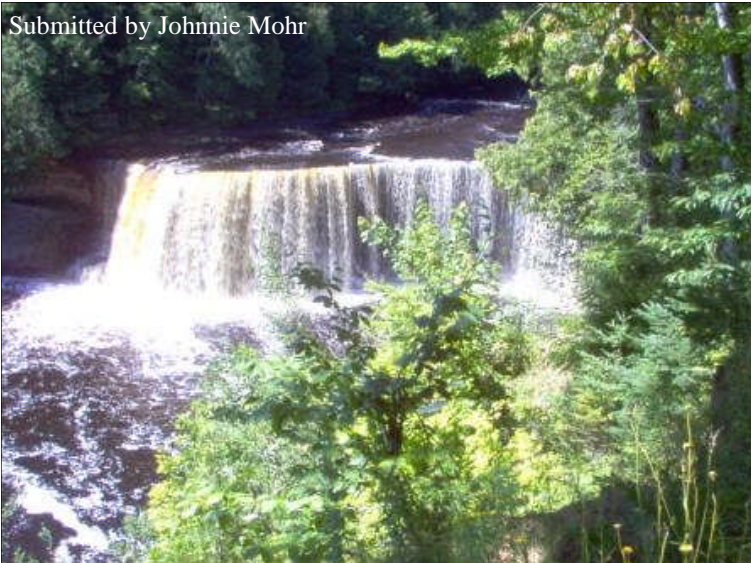
This recipe was on an egg carton. I've tried many different deviled egg recipes but this is my all-time favorite.

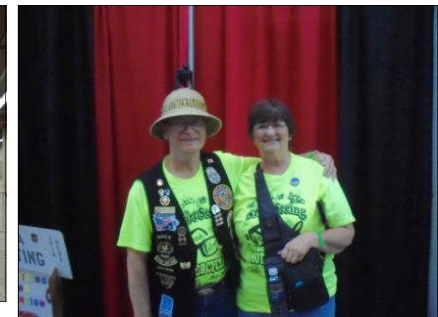
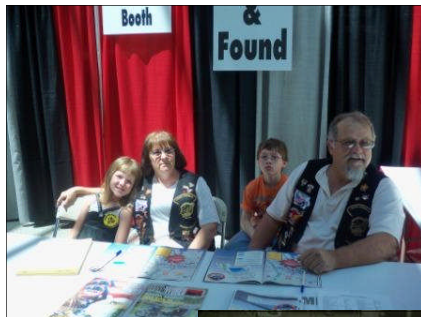
